

## **MLC-5 Cordless Telephone Handset**

Button Labeling Card Card used to note feature or line assigned to each line button.

Channel Button

Button used to change channels for improved

reception.

Line Buttons Five buttons with red lights, used to make/ receive calls. Any unlabeled buttons can be programmed with features.

Low Battery

Light

Light blinks when batteries have less than 15 minutes of use remaining (tone also

generated).

Message Light Light illuminates when you have a voicemail message, fax, or a message from the system operator.

## Imprinted Buttons

Imprinted buttons, including dedicated feature buttons, cannot be changed.

Battery

Press to put a call on hold. Red light flashes while call is on hold. During hold, phone beeps every 60 seconds. More than one call can be on hold at a

time.

Press to show on the status of the handset line button lights, except for On/Off, Low Battery, and Message. Light turns off after 20 seconds.

Press to send a call to another phone.

**Channel** Press to change the

Press to activate the handset to make or answer a call.

## **MLC-5 Cordless Telephone Base Unit**

**Antenna** 

Retractable antenna; extend fully for clear

reception.

Battery Contacts Metal contacts that recharge the handset.

Clean contacts

periodically with a soft

pencil eraser.

Channel Indicator


Electronic display of the channel currently used or programmed. A "P" displays when the telephone is being

programmed.

Directory Card

Erasable card used to record the telephone number assigned to the cordless telephone and to list feature codes.

Message Light Light illuminates when you have a voice-mail message, fax, or message from the system operator.

Dedicated

- Charge a light that illuminates when the handset is in the the base unit and the batteries are charging.
- Talk a light that illuminates when the handset is removed from the base unit and, is turned on using On/Off button.
- Program a light that illuminates when the T/P switch is set to P for programming.

Sliding control used to adjust the volume of the base unit's ring.

Switch used to test and program the telephone.

## **Line Button Lights**

Light	Meaning	
Steady red	The line or the feature programmed onto the line button is in use.	
Flashing red	An incoming call is ringing on this button.	
Fast flashing red	You have put a call on hold on this line button.	
Slow flashing call red	Someone else has put a on hold on this line button.	

#### **Tones**

Tone	Meaning
Dial tone (steady tone)	You can make a call.
Busy (slow repeating tone)	The phone you are calling is busy.
Fast busy (fast repeating tone)	No lines are available.
Alternating high and low tones	You dialed a number incorrectly or misused a feature.
Confirmation tone (double break in dial tone followed by steady tone)	You used a feature properly.
Callback tone five short beeps)	The outside line or the extension is busy and your phone is programmed for Automatic Callback.
Call Waiting tone (one or two beeps while you are on	You have an inside call (one beep) or an outside call (two beeps) waiting.

	Ring	Meaning
=	One long ring	An inside call
	One short ring and one long ring	An outside call
	Two short rings and one long ring	An outside call transferred to you, a returning transferred call, or a returning Callback call

## **Answering Calls**

If you are not on the telephone:

Press On/Off.

After completing the call, press the **On/Off** button again or place the handset on the base unit.

If you are on the telephone:

- Press Hold to put the active call on hold.
- Press the button next the flashing red light to answer the incoming call.

Return to the held call by pressing the button next to the flashing red light.

# Making Inside and Outside Calls

- 1. Extend antennas on both the handset and the base unit.
- For outside calls only, press Status to view which lines or features are in use.
- 3. Press the button for the available line.
- For SA buttons, dial the dialout code and telephone number.
- After completing the call, press On/Off again or place the handset in the base unit.

## Conference

You can participate in a conference call using an MLC-5 Cordless telephone, but you cannot use a cordless telephone to initiate the conference call.

#### **Transfer**

To transfer:

- 1. Press Transfer.
- 2. Press line or SA button.
- 3. Dial extensions or number.
- 4. Announce call, if desired.
- 5. Press **Transfer**, hang up, or return to call on hold.

To one-touch manual transfer:

- 1. Press Auto Dial button.
- 2. Announce call.
- 3. Press **Transfer**, hang up, or return to call on hold.

To one-touch auto transfer

Press Auto Dial button.

Ask your system manager if this feature is available.

## **Programming Buttons**

- 1. Label a button.
- 2. Slide T/P switch to P.
- 3. Press labeled button.
- 4. Dial programming code.
- 5. Repeat Steps 3 and 4 if programming other buttons.
- 6. Slide T/P switch to center.

## **Programming Features**

Some features set up how your phone works and are not programmed onto a button. The ‡ in the Programming Codes Table flags these features. To set these features:

- 1. Slide T/P to P.
- 2. Press ICOM or SA button.
- 3. Dial programming code.
- 4. Repeat Steps 2 and 3 for additional phone set up features.
- 5. Slide T/P to center.

# Programming a Feature Button

- 1. Label a button.
- 2. Slide T/P switch to P.
- 3. Press labeled button.
- 4. Dial \* 20.
- 5. Slide T/P switch to center.

Denotes features that must be programmed onto a line button. Denotes features that set up how your phone works; they are not used by pressing a programmed button.

## **Accessing Features**

Some features must be programmed onto a line button while others can be accessed from a feature code or a programming code. Other features can be accessed from a feature code only. To access features, use the appropriate method as follows:

- Dial a feature code:
- Press programmed button, if available.
- Press Feature button or dial #. (Before using # sign, you must lift the handset.
- 2. Dial the feature code.

## Leave Messages

On busy or unanswered phone:

 Press programmed Leave Message button or press Feature and dial 25.

On display phones without calling:

- 1. Press Feature and dial 53.
- 2. Dial extension.

## **Cancel Messages**

- 1. Press Feature and dial \* 53.
- 2. Dial extension.

## **Receive Messages**

Red message light is on when you have a message or fax, if you are programmed to to be notified of fax arrivals.

To turn your message light off:

• Press the Message button.

## **Post Messages**

You must have programmed a message button using feature code \* 751.

- Press programmed Posted Message button.
- 2. Dial code for message to be posted (01 -20).

To cancel posted messages:

- Press programmed Posted Message button.
- 2. Dial 00.

<sup>◆</sup> Display phones only.

## **Last Number Dial**

To program:

- 1. Label a button.
- 2. Slide T/P switch to P.
- 3. Press button to be programmed.
- 4. Dial \* 84.
- 5. Slide T/P switch to center.

#### To use:

- Press the same type of button used to place the first call, (for example, ICOM or SA).
- Press programmed button, or press Feature or # and dial 84. (Before using # sign, you must lift handset.)

## **Paging**

To program speakerphone paging button:

- 1. Select a non-line or non- **SA** button to program.
- 2. Slide T/P switch to P.
- 3. Press labeled button.
- 4. Dial \* 22 and Group Page or Page All extension.
- 5. Slide T/P switch to center.

To use speakerphone paging:

- 1. Press an ICOM or SA button.
- 2. Press On/Off.
- Press programmed button and, dial company-provided Group Page or Page All number.
- 4. Make announcement after beep.

To use loudspeaker paging:

- 1. Press On/Off.
- Press programmed button, or press Feature and dial 9 and Loudspeaker Page line number.
- 3. Dial code for companydefined zone if necessary.
- 4. Make announcement.

## **System Speed Dial**

Use company-programmed 3-digit codes to dial phone numbers. Ask your system manager for a list of numbers and their associated codes.

#### To program:

- 1. Label a button.
- 2. Slide T/P switch to P.
- 3. Press button to be programmed.
- 4. Dial \* 24.
- 5. Dial 3-digit companysupplied speed dial code.
- 6. Slide T/P switch to center.

#### To use:

 Press On/Off. Then press programmed button, or dial #, and dial 3-digit companysupplied speed dial code.

## **Personal Speed Dial**

Program 2-digit codes with numbers you dial most often, then use feature button to use these codes to dial a number.

To program personal speed dial codes:

- 1. Slide T/P switch to P.
- 2. Dial # and 2-digit code (01 -24), then dial \* 21.
- Dial phone number or account number. (Include entire dialing sequence, for example, dial-out code. Special characters may be needed (See Special Characters Table).
- Repeat Steps 2 and 3 to program additional codes.
- 5. Slide T/P switch to center.

#### To use:

- 1. Press On/Off.
- 2. Dial # and a 2-digit code (01-24).

## **Saved Number Dial**

To program:

- 1. Label a button.
- 2. Slide T/P switch to P.
- 3. Press button to be programmed.
- 4. Dial \* 85.
- 5. Slide T/P switch to center.

#### To save and redial:

- 1. Press programmed button before hanging up.
- 2. To redial call, press same type of button used place the call (ICOM or SA).
- 3. Press programmed button.

## **Special Characters Table**

Features that dial numbers automatically may need special characters to allow for correct dialing or system response.

# Press... Means... Hold Pause. Inserts 1.5 sec. pause in dial sequence. Multiple consecutive pauses allowed.

- ## For Extension Programming only: End of Dialing. Used to signal end of dialing sequence or used to separate grouped digits, for example, account codes from number dialed.
- # End of Dialing. Used to signal end of dialing sequence or used to separate grouped digits, for example, account codes from number dialed.

## Forward and Follow Me Call

#### To program:

- 1. Label a button.
- 2. Slide T/P switch to P.
- 3. Press labeled button.
- 4. Dial \* 33.
- 5. Slide T/P switch to center.

To forward calls to an extension:

- 1. Press an ICOM or SA button.
- 2. Lift handset.
- 3. Press programmed button.
- 4. Dial extension.

To forward calls to an outside number:

- 1. Press an ICOM or SA button.
- 2. Lift handset.
- 3. Press programmed button, or press **Feature** and dial **33**.
- Dial 9 on phones with ICOM buttons or the dial-out code on phones with SA buttons.
- 5. Dial phone number, then dial #.

To set up follow me from another extension:

- 1. Press an **ICOM** or **SA** button.
- 2. Press Feature and dial 34.
- 3. Dial your extension.

To cancel forward and follow me:

- From your extension:
  - 1. Press Feature.
  - 2. Dial 33 and your extension.
- From one extension:
  - 1. Press Feature.
  - 2. Dial \* 34 and your extension.
- Sent from all extensions:
  - 1. Press Feature.
  - 2. Dial \* 34 \* .

## **Call Waiting**

Single beep means inside call waiting; two beeps mean outside call waiting.

To turn call waiting on/off:

- 1. Press Feature and dial 00.
- 2. Press any ICOM or SA button.
- 3. Dial \* 11 to turn on or \* \* 11 to turn off.
- 4. Press Feature and dial \* 00.

To complete a call and answer call waiting:

- 1. When you hear Call Waiting tone, press **On/Off.**
- 2. Lift handset when phone rings.

To put call on hold and pickup call waiting:

- 1. Press Hold.
- Press ICOM or SA Originate
   Only button. (You must have
   ICOM Originate Only or SA
   Originate Only button
   available to pick up call.)
- 3. Press Feature and dial 87.
- **4.** To return to call on hold, press button with fast flashing light.

# Park

To program:

#### See Programming Buttons.

To use park and speakerphone page:

- 1. Park the call.
  - Press programmed Park button.
  - Press Transfer, dial your extension, and press Transfer again or hang up.
- 2. Set up page.
  - For speakerphone page:
    - Press appropriate Group Page or Page All button, or press any ICOM or SA button and dial Group Page or Page All extension:
    - 2. Announce call and give your extension.
  - For loudspeaker page:
     Loudspeaker pages can be made only by using a programmed Loudspeaker Page button, which must be programmed by your company.
    - Press Loudspeaker Page button.
    - 2. Announce call and extension where call is parked.

To pick up a parked call:

- 1. Lift handset.
- Press programmed Pickup button, or press Feature and dial 9.
- 3. Dial extension where call is parked.

## **Pickup**

To program:

- 1. Label a button.
- 2. Slide T/P switch to P.
- 3. Press labeled button.
- 4. Select one of the following:
  - Dial \* 9. For a specific line or extension, dial line number or extension.
  - For group pickup, dial \* 88.

5. Slide T/P switch to center.

To use:

- Press programmed button, or press Feature and dial 9. If button not programmed for specific line or extension, you can manually dial line number or extension, if desired.
- Group Pickup can also be accessed by pressing Feature and dial 88.

#### **Callback**

Use Callback to be notified when a busy extension or outside line is free. Callback works only for busy extensions on **ICOM** button phones; use Line Request for busy outside lines. On SA button phones, Callback works with busy inside extensions; it works with busy outside lines only on SA or Pool buttons. Selective callback which activates feature on call-by-call basis is available from a feature code or from a programmed button. You must program your phone for automatic callback which activates this feature for every call.

To program a selective callback button:

- 1. Label a button.
- 2. Press Feature and dial 00.
- 3. Press labeled button.
- 4. Dial \* 55.
- 5. Press Feature and dial \* 00.

To use selective callback for busy extension:

- Press programmed button; or press Feature and dial 55 when you hear fast busy signal.
- 2. Hang up after five short beeps.
- Lift handset after one long ring, and three short rings. Call is placed when you lift the handset.

To use selective callback for busy outside lines:

- 1. Press **Feature** and dial **55** when you hear fast busy signal, or press programmed button.
- 2. Hang up after five short beeps.
- Lift handset after one long ring, and three short rings. Call is placed when you lift the handset.

To turn automatic callback on/off:

#### See Programming Buttons.

To use automatic callback:

- When you hear five short beeps after you reach a busy extension or outside line, hang up.
- 2. Lift handset after one long ring and three short rings.
- 3. Call is placed when you lift the handset.

## Coverage

For coverage, a co-worker must program an individual coverage button on his/her phone for either primary or secondary coverage. (Secondary coverage offers a two ring delay so you may answer before calls are covered. Primary coverage sends the call immediately to coverage.) You can program buttons for Coverage OFF or Coverage VMS OFF. To prevent coverage of inside or inside/outside calls, use the following procedure:

To program which calls are covered:

- 1. Slide T/P switch to P.
- 2. Press an ICOM or SA button.
- 3. Dial \* \* 48 for outside only calls, or dial \* 48 for both inside and outside calls.
- 4. Slide T/P switch to center.

## **Account Code Entry**

To program:

- 1. Label a button.
- 2. Slide T/P to P.
- 3. Press labeled button.
- 4. Dial \* 82.
- 5. Press Feature and dial \* 00.

To enter an account code before calling:

- Press programmed Account Code button, or press Feature and dial 82.
- 2. Dial account code, followed by #.
- 3. Press outside line or **SA** button.
- 4. Lift handset or press **Speaker- phone.**
- 5. Dial number (including dial-out code if using **SA** button).

Repeat Steps 1 and 2 to change an account code during a call. Caller does not hear you enter the account code. Account code cannot be changed if it was already entered for the call when the call arrived.

## To program a Coverage OFF or a Coverage VMS OFF button:

- 1. Label a button.
- 2. Slide T/P switch to P.
- 3. Press labeled button.
- Dial \* 49 for CoverageOff or \* 46 for Coverage VMS Off.
- 5. Slide T/P switch to center.

#### To use buttons:

- Toggle On the Coverage VMS
   OFF button to prevent outside
   calls from being sent to voice mail
- Toggle On the Coverage OFF button to stop all calls from being sent to coverage.

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
