

# Your GPS receiver operates on two standard AA batteries (not

included). Always use high quality alkaline batteries. To install batteries:

## 1. Twist the D-ring connector counterclockwise.

- 2. Remove the battery compartment door.
- **3.** Insert two AA batteries, ensuring correct polarity alignment.
- 4. Replace the battery compartment door. 5. Twist the D-ring clockwise to lock.
