

- 9. Do not defeat the safety purpose of the polarized or groundingtype plug. A polarized plug has two blades with one wider than the other. Closed Captioning: Allows the viewer to read TV program dialog or voice conversations as on-screen text.

On-screen Menus: Helpful messages (in English or Spanish) for setting TV controls.

Remote Control: Works your LCD TV Monitor features.

Sleep Timer: Turns off the LCD TV Monitor within an amount of time you specify (30-120 minutes from the current time).

SmartLock™: Lets you block viewing of certain TV channels if you do not want your children viewing inappropriate material.

Standard broadcast (VHF/UHF) or Cable TV channel capa-

Stereo capability: Includes a built-in amplifier and twin-speaker system, allowing reception of TV programs broadcast in stereo. **Treble, Bass, and Balance:** Enhance the LCD TV Monitor's sound.

NOTE: This manual covers different versions and models. Not all features described in this manual will match those of your LCD TV Monitor. This is normal and does not require you contacting your dealer or requesting service.

TELEVISION


- Press POWER (b) to turn on the LCD TV Monitor.
- Press VOLUME + to increase the sound level. Or, press VOLUME to lower the sound level.
- Press CH► or CH◄ to select channels.


REMOTE CONTROL

Point the remote control toward the remote sensor on the front of the LCD TV Monitor when operating the LCD TV Monitor with the remote.

BATTERY INSTALLATION

- Remove the battery compartment lid on the back of the remote.
- Place two AAA batteries in the remote. Be sure the (+) and (-) ends of the batteries line up as marked inside the battery compartment.
- Reattach the battery compartment lid.

Auto CH

Video Source button

Press to select the video input source: PC/Video/TV.

Sleep button

Press to set the LCD TV Monitor to turn itself off within a certain time. Details are on page 23.

Status button -

Press to display the current system status (ie, channel).

Picture button

Press to Auto adjust the PC function. Details are on page 27. Also press this button to adjust some of the LCD TV Monitor picture menu items.

Menu button

Press to see the menu. Also press to exit the onscreen menu.

VOL(ume) - button -

Press to decrease the sound. Also press to select or adjust items in the menu.

CH(annel) DN button

Press to adjust the channel down. Also press to select or adjust items in the menu.

Number buttons

Press to select TV channels. When selecting single-digit channels, press the number of the desired channel. The LCD TV Monitor will pause for a few seconds then tune to the selected channel.

A/CH button

Press to alternate from current channel selection to previous channel selection.

-Audio Source button

Press to select the video input source: PC/AV/TV.

Standby (Power) button

Press to turn the LCD TV Monitor) on or off.

MTS Button

Press to select a sound mode if available with the TV programming: Mono, Stereo, or SAP. Details on page 17.

Mute button

Press to eliminate or restore the LCD TV Monitor sound. Mute on will appear on the screen when the sound is muted.

CH(annel) UP button

Press to adjust the channel up. Also press to select or adjust items in the menu.

VOL(ume) + button

Press to increase the sound. Also press to select or adjust items in the menu.

Smart Surf Button

Press to store your favorite channel. Details on page 15.

-100 Button

Press to select the channel from 100 to 125.


ANTENNA CONNECTION



A combination antenna receives normal broadcast channels (VHF 2–13 and UHF 14–69). Your connection is easy because there is only one 75Ω (ohm) antenna jack on the back of your TV, and that's where the antenna goes.

- If your antenna has a round cable (75 ohm) on the end, then you're ready to connect it to the LCD TV Monitor.

 If your antenna has flat, twin-lead wire (300 ohm), you first need to attach the antenna wires to the screws on a 300- to 75-ohm adapter.
- Connect the antenna (or adapter) to the TV jack on the rear of the LCD TV Monitor. If the end of the antenna wire is threaded, screw it down finger tight.




BASIC CABLE TV CONNECTION



Your Cable TV signal into your home may be a single, 75Ω (ohm) cable. If so, this connection is very simple. Follow the step below to connect your Cable TV signal to your new LCD TV Monitor.

Connect the Cable TV signal to the TV jack on the LCD TV Monitor. Screw it down finger tight.



CABLE BOX CONNECTIONS

If you have a Cable Box, follow either set of these steps to complete your connections.

Cable Box with RF In/Out Jacks

This connection will not supply Stereo sound to the LCD TV Monitor. The sound from the Cable Box will be monaural (single-channel, not left and right).

- Connect the Cable TV signal to the IN jack (or RF IN or CABLE IN) on the Cable Box.
- Connect an RF coaxial cable (not supplied) to the OUT jack (or TO TV or RF OUT) of the Cable Box.
- Connect the other end of the coaxial cable to the LCD TV Monitor's TV jack. Screw it down finger tight.
- Set the Channel 3/4 (or Output channel) switch of the Cable Box to 3 or 4. Set the TV to the same channel. When watching TV programming, change channels at the Cable Box, not the LCD TV Monitor.

Cable Box with Audio/Video Out JacksThis connection will supply Stereo sound to the LCD TV Monitor.

- Connect the Cable TV signal to the IN jack (or RF IN or CABLE IN) on the Cable Box.
- Using an RCA-type video cable, connect one end of the video cable to the Video Out jack of the Cable Box.
 Connect the other end of the cable to the yellow VIDEO jack on the rear of the TV.

Video cables are usually marked with yellow and are available from Magnavox or electronics retailers. Video jacks on most equipment are yellow.


Using RCA-type, stereo audio cables, connect one end of the cables to the left and right Audio Out jacks of the Cable Box.


Connect the other end of the cables to the red and white AUDIO ends of the audio cable supplied. Connect the other end of that cable to the Audio 2 jack on the rear of the LCD TV Monitor.

Audio cables are usually marked with red and white and are available from Magnavox or electronics retailers.

The right audio jack is red and the left audio jack is white. Match the cable colors to the jack colors.

Plug the DC adapter into the DC IN jack on the LCD TV Monitor. Plug the power cable into an outlet. Press the Video Source button for the source you are using.





AUDIO/VIDEO INPUT CONNECTIONS




The AUDIO and VIDEO In jacks on the rear of the LCD TV Monitor enable quick connections of other equipment. Connect a VCR, DVD Player, Video Game, Camcorder, etc., to these jacks. To view the material playing on the other equipment, set the LCD TV Monitor to its VIDEO input channel.

- Connect an RCA-style video cable (usually yellow) to the VIDEO OUT jacks of the other equipment (DVD Player, Camcorder, etc.) and to the yellow VIDEO jack on the rear of the LCD TV Monitor.
- If the other equipment has red and white, left and right, stereo audio out jacks: Connect RCA-style audio cables (usually red and white) to the AUDIO OUT (left and right) jacks on the other equipment. Connect the other end of the cables to the red and white AUDIO cable (provided). Connect the AUDIO cable provided to the AUDIO 2 jack on the rear of the LCD TV Monitor. The LCD TV Monitor will receive sound from the other equipment in stereo (from the left and right sound channels).

If the other equipment has only one AUDIO OUT (white) jack: Connect an audio cable to the AUDIO OUT jack on the other equipment. Connect the other end of the cable to the white AUDIO 2 jack on the rear of the LCD TV Monitor. The LCD TV Monitor will receive sound from the other equipment through a single audio channel.

- Plug the DC Adapter into the DC IN jack on the TV. Plug the power cable into an outlet. Turn on the TV and other equipment.
- Press the Video Source buttons to set the TV to its VIDEO channel.
- **Press PLAY** on the other equipment to view its material on the TV.



S-Video Connections


The S(uper)-Video connection on the rear of the LCD TV Monitor can provide you with better picture detail and clarity for the playback of accessory sources such as DBS (digital broadcast satellite), DVD (digital video discs), video games, and S-VHS VCR (video cassette recorder) tapes than the normal antenna picture connections.

NOTE: The accessory device must have an S-VIDEO OUT(put) jack in order for you to complete the connection on this page.

- Connect an S-Video cable to the S-VIDEO jack of the other equipment (DVD Player, Camcorder, etc.) and to the S-VIDEO jack on the rear of the LCD TV Monitor.
- If the other equipment has red and white, left and right, stereo audio out jacks: Connect RCA-style audio cables (usually red and white) to the AUDIO OUT (left and right) jacks on the other equipment. Connect the other end of the cables to the red and white AUDIO cable (provided). Connect the AUDIO cable provided to the AUDIO 2 jack on the rear of the LCD TV Monitor. The LCD TV Monitor will receive sound from the other equipment in stereo (from the left and right sound channels).

If the other equipment has only one AUDIO OUT (white) jack: Connect an audio cable to the AUDIO OUT jack on the other equipment. Connect the white end of the cable to the white end of the audio cable supplied. Connect the other end of that cable to the AUDIO 2 jack on the rear of the LCD TV Monitor. The LCD TV Monitor will receive sound from the other equipment through a single audio channel.

- Plug the DC Adapter into the DC IN jack on the LCD TV Monitor. Plug the power cable into an outlet. Turn on the LCD TV Monitor and other equipment.
- Press the Video Source buttons to set the LCD TV Monitor to its VIDEO channel, if the LCD Monitor does not automatically detect a source change.
- Press PLAY on the other equipment to view its material on the LCD TV Monitor.




PC (Monitor) Connection



This LCD TV Monitor can be used as a PC Monitor. Your computer will have to be equipped with a VGA type video output and VGA cable.


- Connect one end of the VGA Video cable to the Monitor (video) output on the computer to the ANALOG rear jack panel on the LCD TV Monitor.
- Although audio connections are not required, the LCD TV Monitor can reproduce the computers audio out by an AUDIO ADAPTER (supplied) to the Audio output jack on the computer (if available) while connecting the other ends of the Audio cables to the AUDIO 1 Input Jacks on the bottom of the TV. Press the Audio Source button until AUDIO1:PC appears so the TV tunes to the computer audio signal.
- Turn the LCD TV Monitor and the Computer ON.
- Press the VIDEO SOURCE button until PC MODE appears on the screen.




How to use the Tuner Mode


The TUNER MODE allows you to change the LCD TV Monitor's signal input to CABLE or AIR (antenna). It's important for the LCD TV Monitor to know if you want to receive channels from a cable TV signal or an antenna signal.

- Press the MENU button on the remote control to see the onscreen menu.
- Press the ◆(CH UP) or ▼(CH DN) buttons to highlight the TV INSTALL menu.
- Press the (VOL+) or (VOL-) buttons to enter the TV INSTALL menu.








Your LCD TV Monitor can automatically set itself for local area (or cable TV) channels. This makes it easy for you to select only the TV stations in your area by pressing the CH UP or CH DN button.

- Press the MENU button on the remote control to show the onscreen menu.
- Press the ◆(CH UP) or ▼(CH DN) buttons to highlight the TV INSTALL menu.
- Press the (VOL-) or (VOL+) buttons to enter the TV INSTALL menu.




Smart Surf lets you set up channels in a quick viewing list Then, you can use the Smart Surf button on the remote control to switch between different TV programs (channels) that interest you.

- Press the MENU button to show the onscreen menu.

- Press the (VOL+) or (VOL-) buttons to enter the TV Install Menu.

To adjust your LCD TV Monitor Sound, select a channel and follow these steps.



Sound Mode: Adjust to select between Stereo, Mono, or SAP. NOTE: If stereo is not present on a selected show and the TV is placed in Stereo mode, the sound coming from the TV will remain in Mono mode.



SMART LOCK



The Smart Lock feature is an integrated circuit that receives and processes data sent by broadcasters, or other program providers, that contain program content advisories. When programmed by the viewer, a TV with Smart Lock can respond to the content advisories and block program content that may be found objectionable (such as offensive language, violence, sexual situations, etc.). This is a great feature to censor the type of viewing children may watch.

Smart Lock offers various BLOCKING controls from which to choose:

Access Code - An Access Code must be set to prevent children from unblocking questionable or censored programming set by their parents.

Block Enable - After an access code has been programmed, you can block programming depending on the received rating and user setting.

Movie Ratings - Certain blocking options exist which will block programming based on ratings patterned by the Motion Pictures Association of America.

TV Ratings - Just like the Movie Ratings, programs can be blocked from viewing using standard TV ratings set by TV broadcasters.

MOVIE RATINGS

G: General Audience - All ages admitted. Most parents would find this program suitable for all ages. This type of programming contains little or no violence, no strong language, and little or no sexual dialog or situations.

PG: Parental Guidance Suggested -

This programming contains material that parents may find unsuitable for younger children. It may contain one or more of the following: moderate violence, some sexual situations, infrequent coarse language, or some suggestive dialog.

PG-13: Parents Strongly Cautioned -

This programming contains material that parents may find unsuitable for children under the age of 13. It contains one or more of the following: violence, sexual situations, coarse language, or suggestive dialog.

R: Restricted -This programming is specifically designed for adults. Anyone under the age of 17 should only view this programming with an accompanying parent or adult guardian. It contains one or more of the following: intense violence, intense sexual situations, strong coarse language, or intensely suggestive dialog.

NC-17: No children under the age of 17 will be admitted. - This type of programming should be viewed by adults only. It contains graphic violence, explicit sex, or crude, indecent language.

X: Adults Only - This type of programming contains one or more of the following: very graphic violence, very graphic and explicit or indecent sexual acts, and very coarse and intensely suggestive language.

TV RATINGS

TV-Y All children - Appropriate for all children. Designed for a very young audience, including children ages 2-6. This type of programming is not expected to frighten younger children.

TV-Y7 Directed to Older Children -

Designed for children age 7 and above. It may be more appropriate for children who can distinguish between make-believe and reality. This programming may include mild fantasy and comic violence (FV or fantasy violence).

TV-G General Audience - Most parents would find this programming suitable for all ages. This type of programming contains little or no violence, no strong language, and little or no sexual dialog or situations.

TV-PG Parental Guidance Suggested -

Contains material that parents may find unsuitable for younger children. This type of programming contains one or more of the following: Moderate violence (V), some sexual situations (S), infrequent coarse language (L), or some suggestive dialog (D).

TV-14 Parents Strongly Cautioned -

Contains some material that many parents would find unsuitable for children under age 14. This type of programming contains one or more of the following: intense violence (V), intense sexual situations (S), strong coarse language (L), or intensely suggestive dialog (D).

TV-MA Mature Audience Only -

Specifically designed to be viewed by adults and may be unsuitable for children under 17. This type of programming contains one or more of the following: graphic violence (V), explicit sexual situations (S), or crude, indecent language (L).

SMART LOCK ACCESS CODE

Over the next few pages you'll learn how to block programs and understand the rating terms for certain broadcasts. First, set an access code.


- **Press the MENU button** to see the onscreen menu.
- Press the ◆(CH UP) or ▼(CH DN) buttons to highlight the FEATURES menu.
- Press the (VOL+) or (VOL-) buttons to enter the FEATURES menu.
- Press the ◆(CH UP) or ▼(CH DN) buttons to select SMART LOCK.
- Press the (VOL+) or (VOL-) buttons. INPUT USER CODE will appear on the screen.
- Use the Number buttons to enter 9, 2, 0, 3. This is the LCD TV MONITOR's default code. "----" will appear on the screen as you enter the code. This protects its identity. If INCORRECT appears, repeat steps 5 and 6.
- The SMART LOCK menu will appear. Check to see if CHANGE USER CODE is highlighted, press the (VOL+) or ((VOL-) buttons.
- The screen will prompt you to enter a new code. Enter a new four-digit code using the Number buttons. The screen will prompt you to confirm the code you just entered. Enter your same new code again. "----" will appear when you enter your new code, then the Smart Lock menu will appear.
- **Press MENU** repeatedly to remove the menu from the screen.

To change the Access Code later, follow steps 1-6 so the Smart Lock menu appears.

HELPFUL HINTS

You cannot unblock a channel without knowing your code or changing it. If your code changes, someone has altered it and possibly viewed blocked channels.

If you forget your access code, you must reset the Factory Settings, details on page 27.




SMART LOCK- BLOCK ENABLE



A fter your personal access code has been set (see the previous page), you are ready to select the channels or inputs you want to block out or censor.

- **Press the MENU button** to see the onscreen menu.
- Press the ◆(CH UP) or ▼(CH DN) buttons to highlight the FEATURES menu.
- Press the (VOL+) or (VOL-) buttons to enter the FEATURES menu.
- Press the ◆(CH UP) or ▼(CH DN) buttons to select SMART LOCK.
- Press the (VOL+) or (VOL-) buttons INPUT USER CODE will appear.
- Use the Number buttons to enter your access code.
- Press the ◆(CH UP) or ▼(CH DN) buttons to select BLOCK ENABLE.
- Press the (VOL+) button to block a certain channel or (VOL-) button to unblock a channel.

NOTE: Repeat the steps above to block additional channels.



HELPFUL HINT

If you enter your Access Code to view a blocked channel, ALL blocked channels will be viewable until you turn off the TV. Channels will be blocked as before when you turn on the TV again.

When you set one of the ratings (Movie or TV) to ON, Block Enable will automatically turned on. If you change the setting to OFF or when no rating is set, Block Enable will be turned off.







SLEEPTIMER



CLOSED CAPTIONS



Closed Captioning (CC) allows you to read the voice content of television programs on the TV screen. Designed to help the hearing impaired, this feature uses onscreen "text boxes" to show dialogue and conversations while the TV program is in progress.

- Press the MENU buttons to see the onscreen menu.
- Press the ◆(CH UP) or ▼(CH DN) buttons to highlight the FEATURES
- Press the (VOL+) or (VOL-) buttons to enter the FEATURES menu.
- Press the ◆(CH UP) or ▼(CH DN) buttons to select CLOSE CAPTION.
- Press the (VOL+) or (VOL-) buttons to select the closed caption you want: NONE, CC1, CC2, Txt1, or Txt2.
- **Press MENU** repeatedly to remove the menu from the screen.



HELPFUL HINT


Not all TV programs and product commercials are broadcast with Closed Captioning (CC). Nor are all Closed Captioning MODES (CAPTION 1–2 or TEXT 1–2) necessarily being used by broadcast stations during the transmission of a program offering Closed Captioning. Refer to your area's TV program listings for the stations and times of shows being broadcast with Closed Captioning.




Have you ever wished you could freeze the picture on the television broadcast to write down telephone number or an address? Your new LCD TV Monitor will allow you to do just that.

- Press the MENU button on the remote control to see the onscreen menu.
- Press the ◆(CH UP) or ▼(CH DN) buttons to highlight the FEATURES menu.
- Press the the (VOL+) or (VOL-) buttons to enter the FEATURES menu.
- Press the ◆(CH UP) or ▼(CH DN) buttons to highlight FREEZE.
- Press the the (VOL+) or (VOL-) buttons to turn FREEZE ON or OFF.
- **Press the MENU button** repeatedly to clear the menu from the screen.

NOTE: If the picture has been frozen, follow these steps again to turn it OFF.







HELPFUL HINT

After freezing a picture on the screen, when the FREEZE control is turned OFF, the normal signal programming will be shown at present time. The signal that was being shown while the picture was frozen will not be viewable.


For the FREEZE feature to be most useful, always return to the TV INSTALL menu, highlight FREEZE, then exit the menu. If you have done this, when you see a telephone number or an address that you want to write down, just press the MENU and the VOL+ or VOL- twice to turn FREEZE ON.

LANGUAGE SETTINGS



For English or Spanish-speaking TV owners, an onscreen LANGUAGE option is present. The LANGUAGE control enables you to set the TV's onscreen menu to be shown in either English or Spanish.


Language: Allows you to choose an English or Spanish OSD.

Resolution Notice: Shows the current PC resolution timing.

DPMS: (Display Power Management Signaling) When ON, this make the screen black when there is no signal present, or the screen saver has timed out.

<u>Mode Message:</u> When ON, it shows the LCD Monitor's mode. When OFF, it will only show Video and Cable/Air.

<u>Factory Settings</u>: Reverts all picture, sound, color, and feature settings to the original factory settings.

TROUBLESHOOTING TIPS



No Power

- Check the TV power cord. Disconnect the power cord from the power outlet for 10 seconds, then reinsert the plug into the outlet. Press POWER to turn on the TV again.
- Make sure the outlet is not on a wall switch.
- Make sure a fuse has not blown at the power outlet.

No Picture

- Check the antenna or Cable TV connections. Connect the antenna or Cable TV signal securely to the TV's 75Ω jack on the rear of the TV.
- Set TUNER MODE correctly. Details are on page 12.
- Activate AUTO PROGRAM to find all available channels. Details are on page 13.

No Sound

- Press the VOL+ and VOL- buttons to adjust the volume.
- Press the MUTE button on the remote control to cancel or restore the volume.
- If you have connected other equipment to the TV (such as a VCR or DVD Player), make sure the audio cables are connected securely between the TV and the other equipment.
- Check the SOUND settings. Details are on page 18 or 30.

Remote Control does not work.

- Check the batteries. If necessary, replace them with two AAA heavy duty (zinc chloride) or alkaline batteries.
- Clean the remote control as well as the remote control sensor on the front of the TV.
- Check the TV power cord. Disconnect the power cord from the power outlet for 10 seconds, then reinsert the plug into the outlet. Press POWER to turn on the TV again.
- Make sure the outlet is not on a wall switch.
- Make sure a fuse has not blown at the power outlet.
- Always point the remote control toward the front of the TV (toward the remote sensor).

TV displays wrong channel or no channels.

- Repeat channel selection.
- Add the channel number(s) into the TV's memory. Use STORE. Details are on page 14.
- Make sure TUNER MODE is set correctly. Details are on page 11. Then activate AUTO PROGRAM to set up all available channels. Details are on page 12.

CARE AND CLEANING

WARNING concerning stationary images on the TV

screen: Do not leave fixed images on the screen for extended periods of time. This can cause uneven aging of the picture tube. Normal use of the TV should involve viewing of programs that have constantly moving or changing images. Do not leave nonmoving images on screen for extended periods of time. Do not display the same images too frequently; if you do, subtle "ghost" images can be left on the picture tube. Sources of stationary images may be Laser discs, video games, Compact Discs Interactive (CD-i), or paused Digital Video Discs (DVDs) or videotapes.

Here are some common examples of stationary images:

- DVD menus list DVD content.
- Letterbox black bars appear at the top and bottom of the TV screen when a wide screen (16:9) movie is viewed on a TV with standard (4:3) aspect ratio. This is available with some DVDs.
- Video game images and scoreboards
- Television station logos cause a problem if they are bright and stationary. Moving or low-contrast graphics are less likely to damage the picture tube.
- Stock market tickers may appear at the bottom of the TV screen if the TV programming covers this news.
- Shopping channel logos, pricing displays may be bright and may appear constantly during the show. These are usually in the same location on the TV screen.

TV Location

- To avoid cabinet warping, cabinet color changes, and an increased chance of TV failure, do not place the TV where temperatures can become excessively hot (for example, in direct sunlight or near a heating appliance).
- Allow a free flow of air around the TV.

Cleaning

- To avoid possible shock hazard, remove the TV's power cord from the electrical outlet before cleaning.
- Regularly dust the TV with a dry, non-scratching duster.
- When cleaning the TV, take care not to scratch or damage the screen surface. Avoid wearing jewelry or using anything abrasive. Do not use household cleaners. Wipe the screen with a clean cloth dampened with water. Use even, easy, vertical strokes when cleaning.
- Gently wipe the cabinet surfaces with a clean cloth or a sponge dampened in a solution of cool, clear water and a mild soap or detergent. Use a clean, dry cloth to dry the wiped surfaces.
- Occasionally vacuum the vents on the rear of the TV.
- Never use thinners, insecticide sprays, or other chemicals on or near the cabinet. They may blemish the cabinet permanently.


